Principal Jeff Martin at Grover Heights Elementary School has a concern for the students and staffs safety at his school. The northwest corner of our campus is the area of concern. 8<sup>th</sup> Street turns into Ritchie Road and as one turns right onto Ritchie Road from 8<sup>th</sup> Street the visibility is poor. Cars are currently allowed to park on that near corner obstructing a clear view of pedestrian and oncoming car traffic. The section of curbing is only about 15-20 feet that they are requesting be painted red. The exact location is on the south side of Ritchie Road from the corner to the school parking lot exit.

Principal Martin believes that this is an unsafe situation and that taking this simple step will increase the safety of everyone in our Grover Beach community, especially students, staff and parents who frequent our campus.
